

**CITY OF SWISHER, IOWA
CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
JUNE 9, 2025**

Mayor Brian Wernimont called the Swisher City Council meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Council members Curt Cline, Daryl Hynek, Kody Pudil, Adam Roeder, and Michael Stagg were present. Also present was City Attorney Mark Parmenter, Public Works Superintendent Justin Fields, and City Clerk Shelley Annis.

Motion Cline, 2nd Stagg to approve the agenda – all aye.

Motion Stagg, 2nd Roeder to approve the consent agenda items – all aye.

The Johnson County Sheriff, and Ion Environmental submitted written reports. Tim Cutsforth with HR Green gave the Engineer's report.

Mayor Wernimont opened the public hearing at 6:43 p.m. on proposed plans, specifications, form of contract and estimate of cost for the Swisher Pavement Rehabilitation and Parking Lots – 2025 Project. Clerk Annis reported that the notice had been published and posted as required with no comment being received prior to the public hearing. With no on present commenting, Mayor Wernimont closed the public hearing at 6:44 p.m.

Motion Pudil, 2nd Cline to approve Resolution 22-2025 finally Approving And Confirming Plans, Specifications, Form Of Contract And Estimate Of Cost for the Swisher Pavement Rehabilitation and Parking Lots – 2025 Project. Cline, Hynek, Pudil, Roeder, Stagg – aye.

Motion Pudil, 2nd Roeder to approve Resolution 23-2025 to Provide for Notice of Taking of Bids for the Swisher Pavement Rehabilitation and Parking Lots – 2025 Project. Hynek, Pudil, Roeder, Stagg, Cline – aye.

HR Green Engineer Tim Cutsforth reported on bids received for the Swisher Pavement Rehabilitation and Parking Lots – 2025 Project. HR Green recommends the Council award the project to Kluesner Construction, Farley, IA.

Motion Roeder, 2nd Cline to approve Resolution 24-2025 awarding a Contract for the Swisher Pavement Rehabilitation and Parking Lots – 2025 Project to Kluesner Construction, Farley, IA for \$73,309.96. Pudil, Roeder, Stagg, Cline, Hynek – aye.

Motion Hynek, 2nd Pudil to approve Resolution 25-2025 transferring \$292,972.50 from the LOST Fund, \$67,976.25 from the TIF Fund, and \$70,025.65 from the Sewer Fund to Debt Service Funds to make the June 1, 2025 Bond and Loan Principal & Interest payments for the City. Stagg, Cline, Hynek, Roeder, Pudil – aye.

Motion Roeder, 2nd Stagg to approve Resolution 26-2025 approving Pay App #9 for \$164,773.57 to Dave Schmitt Construction Co., Inc., Cedar Rapids, IA for work completed through May 31, 2025 on the Sanitary Sewer Project. Cline, Hynek, Pudil, Roeder, Stagg – aye.

Motion Hynek, 2nd Roeder to approve 1st Reading of Ordinance 17-2025 amending City Code Chapter 41.14 pertaining to Fireworks as to reflect 2025 Legislative changes. Hynek, Pudil, Roeder, Stagg, Cline – aye.

Motion Pudil, 2nd Stagg to waive the requirement of separate 2nd and 3rd Readings of Ordinance 17-2025. Pudil, Roeder, Stagg, Cline, Hynek – aye.

Motion Hynek, 2nd Roeder to approve the 2nd and 3rd Readings of Ordinance 17-2025. Roeder, Stagg, Cline, Hynek, Pudil – aye.

Motion Stagg, 2nd Cline to approve the 1st Readings of Ordinance 18-2025 amending City Code Chapter 166.24 Preliminary Plat and 166.28 Final Plat pertaining to the number of copies to be submitted. Stagg, Cline, Hynek, Pudil, Roeder – aye.

Motion Pudil, 2nd Roeder to waive the requirement of separate 2nd and 3rd Readings of Ordinance 18-2025. Cline, Hynek, Pudil, Roeder, Stagg – aye.

Motion Pudil, 2nd Roeder to approve the 2nd and 3rd Readings of Ordinance 18-2025. Hynek, Pudil, Roeder, Stagg, Cline – aye.

Motion Roeder, 2nd Stagg to approve the 1st Reading of Ordinance 19-2025 amending City Code Chapter 106.08-Collection Fee, increasing the monthly solid waste collection fees. Pudil, Roeder, Stagg, Cline, Hynek – aye.

Upon the advice of City Attorney Parmenter, Mayor Wernimont announced the possibility that the City Council may go into a closed session pursuant to Iowa Code Section Section 21.5 subsection 1, paragraph (i), “ To evaluate the professional competency of an individual whose appointment, hiring, performance or discharge is being considered when necessary to prevent needless and irreparable injury to that individual’s reputation and that individual requests a closed session”. A city employee requested a closed session with the City Council.

Motion Pudil, 2nd Stagg to go into closed session at 6:56 p.m. Roeder, Stagg, Cline, Hynek, Pudil – aye.

Motion Cline, 2nd Roeder to return to regular session at 7:59 p.m. Roeder, Stagg, Cline, Hynek, Pudil – aye.

Motion Pudil, 2nd Stagg to direct Mayor Wernimont to issue a written reprimand for violation of city policy to the employee, and to be placed into the employee’s personnel file. Stagg, Cline, Hynek, Pudil, Roeder – aye.

Motion Pudil, 2nd Roeder to adjourn the meeting at 8:02 p.m. – all aye.
